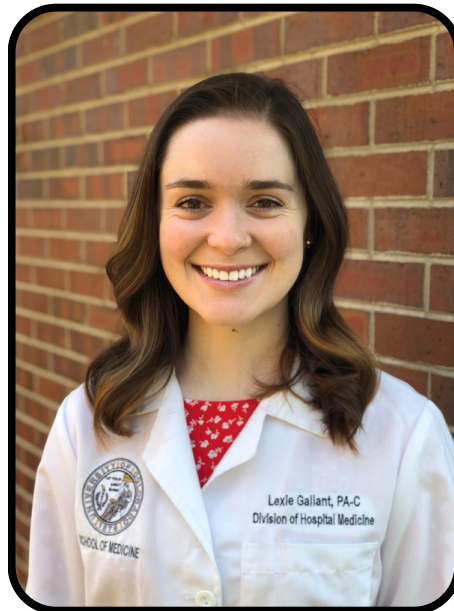

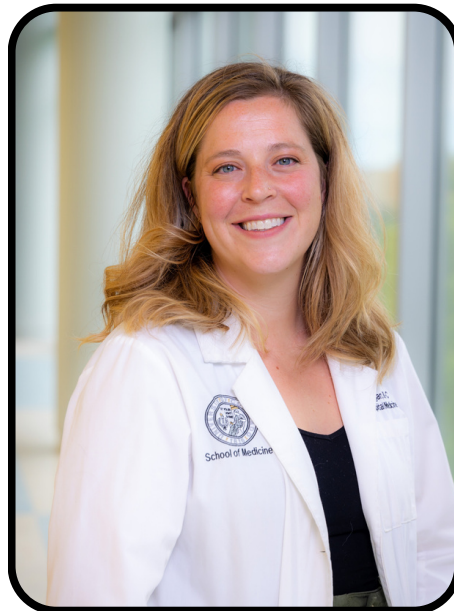
Outside of work, he is an advocate for animal rescue and welfare, enjoys cooking and landscaping, and is always in search of the perfect beach.

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Hannah Anderson, MSPAS, PA-C

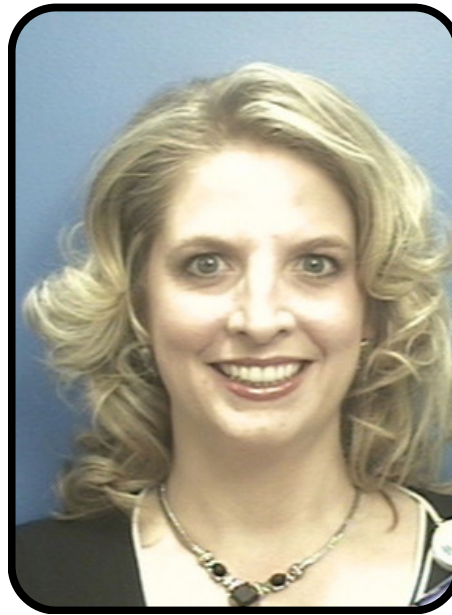

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Kristen Young, MSPAS, PA-C

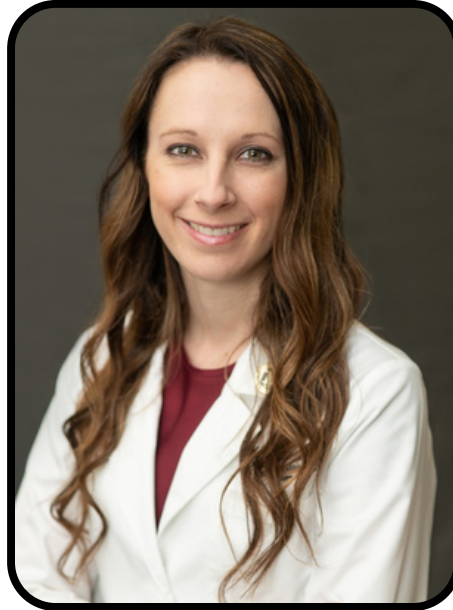

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Lisa Pierce, DNP, APRN, CPNP-AC

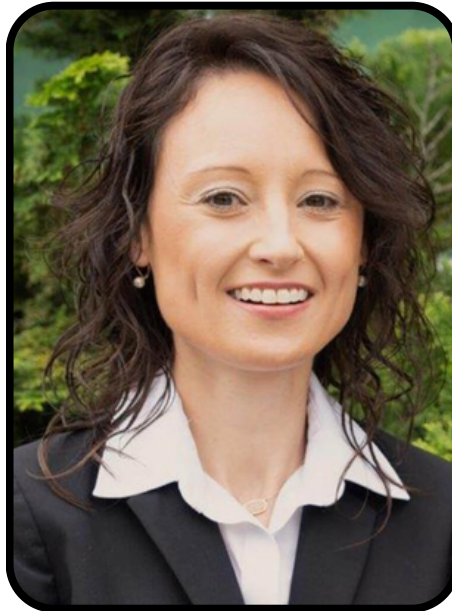

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Meghan Weber, DNP, MBA, APRN, FNP-C

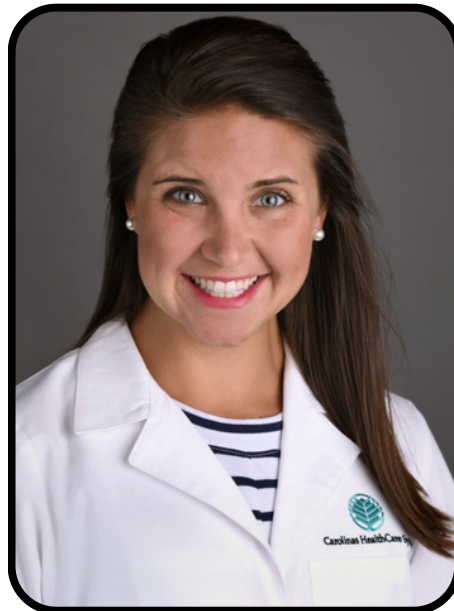

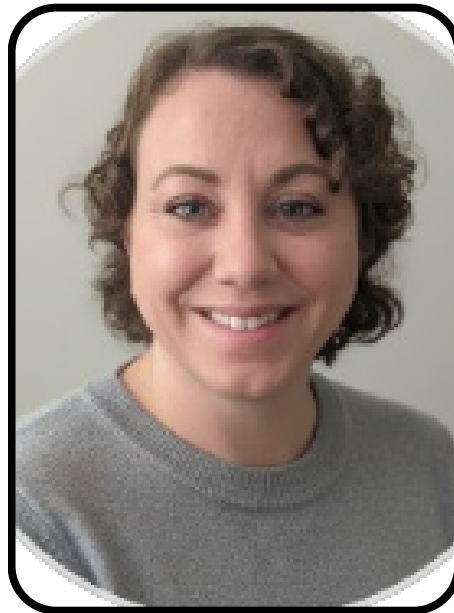
Clinically, she has practiced in critical care for twenty years.
